Sunday 16th March is the Second Sunday of Lent

The readings and prayers can be found in the purple books on page 157. The first reading is from the Book of Genesis, which describes the Covenant that God makes with Abraham, and the Promise that accompanies it. We too are in a covenanted relationship with our Lord and have received His promise of eternal life, thanks to our baptism. The Covenant, like that with Abrahm, cannot be broken by God, and is given to us out of love not because we have earned it. This Lent we are trying to live as God's people, joined to Him by the Covenant. In Saint Luke's Gospel, we hear of Jesus being transfigured on Mount Tabor, where His glory is revealed to Peter, James and John. This reminds us that as baptised people we too are called to share in the glory of the Lord, and we too will be transfigured one day in heaven, and that our call to live out the glory of the Lord starts here on earth.

This Sunday, Fr Ian Vane, who lives in Dorking, will be celebrating all the Masses, and Fr Alexander will be celebrating all the Masses at Ashtead, while Fr Chris goes to Dorking.

Liturgical notes

Lent has begun. You will notice a few differences in the liturgy. When we have an organist, the organ is only used to support the singing. There are no flower arrangements in Church. The Gloria is not said or sung at Mass. Lent lasts 40 days, and Sundays are not part of Lent, and neither are important feast days such as St Patrick (March 17th), St Joseph (19th March), and the Annunciation of the Lord (25th March). Other Saints' days are commemorations in Lent, in other words, only the opening prayer is used, and the vestments are purple.

On Tuesday morning, at 7am, we have Mass for early risers and those going to work.

On Friday, Stations of the Cross are at 7pm, and will last about 25 minutes.

Daily Mass in the week is on Monday, Wednesday and Friday at 10am.

On Tuesday Mass is at 7am and on Thursday, Mass is at 7pm.

Confessions this Saturday are at 10.30am, accompanied by Adoration, and last until at least 11am.

Monday is the feast of Saint Patrick, patron saint of Ireland.

Wednesday is the feast of Saint Joseph, patron of the Universal Church, and Husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Rite of Election

Last Saturday the diocese gathered at Arundel Cathedral for the Rite of Election, where those to be baptised at Easter, who are called catechumens, are enrolled in the Book of the Elect. It was a great occasion, and very good to see the large number of people who are going to be baptised in our parishes at Easter, people of all ages and all backgrounds. Also gathered were the candidates for reception into full communion with the Church, people who are already baptised but who will become Catholics at Easter. Four of us were present Zoe and Tom, who are candidates, and Mia and Jenson who are catechumens. Let us pray for them this Lent as they prepare to be baptised or received into the Church at the Easter Vigil.

The Syrians in our diocese, of whom there are quite a few, are deeply worried by the recent news of massacres and Islamist terror in Syria, and ask for our prayers. This coming Saturday we have Exposition for 30 minutes starting at 10.30am. Could we make this for their intention, and let them know?
