20th October 2024 is the Twenty-Ninth Sunday of the Year.

The first reading, from the prophet Isaiah, is the Song of the Suffering Servant, in which we see foretold the sufferings of Jesus, through which He redeems the world. In the Gospel, from Saint Mark, we hear the story of James and John wanting special positions in the Kingdom of God. Jesus teaches us that we must not seek power, and not seek to be important, or to make our authority felt. Rather the Christian way is that of the Saviour himself – humility. He explains that ‘the Son of Man himself did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.’

This runs clean counter to the world's way of doing things and is a challenge to us all!

This Sunday there is a retiring collection for World Mission Sunday.

Liturgical notes

We are in the month of October, dedicated to the Holy Rosary. It is also the month of prayer for the missions.

On days when there is no feast, we shall celebrate either a Votive Mass of the Blessed Virgin or the Mass for the Propagation of the Gospel. On weekdays, we shall recite the Rosary after the morning Mass.

Tuesday is the feast of **Saint John Paul II**, pope, whose life and teaching require no introduction.

Wednesday is the feast of **Saint John of Capistrano** (1386 – 1456). After studying and practising law, he became a Franciscan friar famous for his preaching. At the end of his life he led a crusade against the invading Turks and raised the siege of Belgrade. He died of bubonic plague. He is the patron saint of military chaplains.

Thursday is the feast of **Saint Anthony Mary Claret**, bishop (1807 – 1870). He spent his energy in preaching and propagating the faith in his native Catalonia, and was later made Archbishop of Santiago de Cuba, where he did much to reform and establish the Church. According to Wikipedia: “Claret was an exceptional preacher with incredible charisms: witnesses said his body would become transfigured while preaching or in prayer, he would levitate up to six feet off the ground at times in front of credible witnesses; he stopped a series of earthquakes in Cuba by kneeling on the ground and placing his palms to the earth while uttering prayers; he could calm terrible storms by raising a hand to the sky and blessing the storm clouds; he experienced apparitions of both Jesus and Mary, and was even seen walking on water. In addition, a supernatural light that radiated from his body while he was saying Mass was seen by many. It was so intense at times that one witness said he saw the light radiate from his body behind the altar all the way to the sacristy. Queen Isabella of Spain produced a written statement solemnly declaring that she had personally witnessed this phenomenon.”

The results of the count last week are as follows, with the previous three weeks' counts in brackets: 6pm – 108 (82, 89,72); 8.30am – 82 (66, 74,76); 10.30am- 137 (198, 147,143). The total Sunday attendance was 327 (346, 310, 291). Many thanks for allowing yourselves to be counted, and to the clickers for counting you! The resulting number crunching means that our average for the 6pm Mass is **87.75**, for the 8.30am Mass **74.5**, and for the 10.30am Mass **156.25**. Our average Sunday attendance is **318.5**. These figures will now be submitted to the diocese.

James Hugh Delahunt RIP

We have heard the sad news of the death of James Hugh Delahunt, at the age of 90 years. He was born on 27th July 1934 and died on 10th October 2024 at Appleby House Care Home, Longmead Road, Epsom. His funeral Mass will take place here on Thursday 7th November, at 11am. Let us pray for the repose of his soul and for his family at this sad and difficult time for them.

November is coming, the start of which is marked by two very important feasts.

On the first, it is the **Solemnity of All Saints, which is a holy day of obligation**, and which is the commemoration of all those who are saints, and dwelling in the presence of God, though they might not be recognised as such as yet, if ever.

Among them, we hope, are many of our friends and relations who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith.

There will be two Masses for **All Saints: 7pm on Thursday, the Vigil, and 10am on the day itself.**

The following day is the Commemoration of All Souls, otherwise known as the Day of the Dead, when we are urged to pray for the faithful departed, or Holy Souls. It is traditional on this day or close to this day, to visit a cemetery to pray for the dead and to pray at the graves of friends and relations. You are invited, therefore, to gather at the cemetery in Ewell village – the opposite side of the road to the Anglican church – **at 12 noon for prayers**; after which Fr Alexander will at your request visit and bless individual graves. A plenary Indulgence is granted to all those who visit to a cemetery and pray for the Holy Souls, along with Confession and Holy Communion, applicable to a soul in Purgatory, during the first week in November.

Because 2nd November is a Saturday, it is proposed that the Mass on 3rd November be offered for all who have died this year in the parish. All who have lost someone this last year are invited to their commemoration at the altar of God.

On Wednesday 6th November, representatives of the Safeguarding Team from the Saint Philip Howard Centre will be joining us at 11am to offer the mandatory safeguarding training, face to face, so we do not have to do it online. This session will last about an hour, though if you have questions etc, it may well go on for longer. Please note the date, and please take this announcement as your invitation to attend if you are a parish volunteer, or if you are interested in becoming one, or if you are interested in safeguarding. Please also sign the list in the sacristy.

On Tuesday 12th November, the deanery clergy meet as usual:

but before the meeting there is a Mass for the deceased clergy who have served in this deanery at 11am in St Michael's in Ashted, to which you are all invited. That very same evening, the parish core teams of the whole deanery have been invited to Saint Andrew's school for an evening of prayer and reflection, from 7-9pm.

Daily Mass in the week is on Mondays, Wednesday and Fridays at 10am. On Thursday, Mass is at 7pm.

Confessions are on Saturday mornings at 10.30am, until 11am (at the earliest).

During Confessions, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed for silent Adoration.

Fr Alexander has decided to run a course, though that is probably too grand a term.

This is not an introduction to Catholicism or a RCIA course, but rather a series of encounters to which one can dip into and out of at will, and will be 'An A to Z of Catholicism'. The gimmick is to talk about a series of Catholic topics in alphabetical order: this week it is the Body. All are welcome. This will take place after the 7pm Mass on Thursday.

The UK has an organisation, the Samaritans, dedicated to persuading people not to kill themselves.

We have always seen suicide as an evil, something that should be avoided at all costs. We have always believed that there are solutions to all the problems of life, and that there is another way forward to people tempted to kill themselves.
